

# Sports Premium Expenditure: St Gregory the Great Catholic Primary School

## Statement

The DfE have made available £8000 lump sum per school and £5 per pupil funding to promote and develop the teaching of primary PE and increase opportunities for inter school sport and competition.

## Funding period

The additional funding will be paid to eligible schools in the academic years 2013 - 2020

## Summary and Objectives of Pupil Premium Spending

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

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## Summary of spending and actions taken:

The following plan for this year has been formulated. The key principles are that we build upon the knowledge and quality of teaching sports with quality equipment.

**September 2016-August 2017**

Item / Project	Cost	Impact
Fitness Trail	£3902	Daily opportunity for children to exercise independently, challenging themselves to take on new elements of the trail. Children have often chosen this as part of their PDR sessions and their in a notable increase in child participation in active sessions.
Benches	£624	Increase in quality of teaching and learning Gymnastics. Supported by teacher feedback and lesson observations.
Tumbling Mats	£176	Additional teaching scope for gymnastics. This has meant that pupils have been able to use floor spaces in the primary and has enhanced the provision during these sessions.
Athletics Equipment	£690	Additional teaching equipment to enhance the PE teaching of YR 3 as part of whole school set-up.
Basketball Stand	£120	As part of pupil voice sessions across KS1/2 pupils wanted opportunities to practice ball skills. They wanted equipment that they could plan uses for but that did not mean they would need to play team games. The planning evidence shows that pupils engage with this on a regular basis
Sports Day Equipment	£200	Children motivated to practice hard during the school day and at home in order to achieve their PB at sports day.

Maypole and Braids	£455	Children provided with dance opportunities linked to local customs.
General Balls, bats, shuttlecocks, hurdles, bibs, rugby class kit, agility hoops, goals, orienteering pack	£1119	Children exposed to wide range of sports activities which they may then pursue to maintain fitness in later life, and quality sports experience.
